University College of the North (UCN) is committed to building a workforce that is representative of the populations we serve. Applications are invited from individuals who have a demonstrated interest and ability to work with Aboriginal learners and mature students.

The Position: UCN is seeking an individual to coordinate the second intake in the Bachelor of Midwifery Program in southern Manitoba and to act as an instructor in the program. The administrative role will include management of the day to day operations of the program in close cooperation with the Dean of the Faculty of Health, scheduling class times and locations, identifying instructors and providing support to students, instructors, and preceptors. The incumbent will also have instructional duties in the area of midwifery education and will be responsible for classroom management, student supervision and advising, maintenance of student records and grades, and other administrative tasks.

Qualifications: The successful candidate will hold a Masters Degree in Midwifery or a Bachelor Degree in Midwifery with a Certificate in Adult Education. Eligible to register as a practicing midwife with the College of Midwives of Manitoba. The successful candidate will have a minimum of 4 years experience as a practicing midwife and a background in or experience with Aboriginal culture and ability to work with a variety of Aboriginal stakeholders. The ability to examine and critically analyze historical and contemporary topics directly related to the role of midwives locally, provincially, nationally and globally. Good communication skills (both oral and written), managing for results and change, as well as strong interpersonal, organizational, thinking, leadership and computer skills are required. Crucial to this position is a demonstrated ability to understand cultural influences and issues specific to adult learners in northern communities. Personal experience and knowledge and understanding of the Aboriginal culture are essential.

Applicants are asked to provide a cover letter, resume, three written references, and copies of transcripts with their application.

Employment equity is a factor in the selection process. Applicants are invited to indicate in their covering letter or resume if they are from any of the following groups: Aboriginal people, persons with disabilities, visible minorities, women. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.

Salary: \$27.40 to \$40.70 hourly, plus remoteness and coordinator allowances

Educational Supplement: Masters Degree \$2,650 per annum; PhD \$5,300 per annum
